

### OVERVIEW & INSTALLATION

This guide covers the most common tasks required to get a **Digium TE205P** dual-span T1/E1 card working efficiently with the PBX — installing the card into the server and creating the digital trunk.

#### INSTALL THE CARD INTO THE PBX SERVER

- 1. Set the **jumper** on the TE205P card to select the operation mode: **T1** or **E1**.
- 2. Power off the the PBX server properly.
- 3. Open the server.
- 4. Insert the TE205P card into a free **PCI slot**.
- 5. Tighten the screw.
- 6. Close the server.
- 7. Connect the **T1/E1 port** to the service provider's port.
- 8. Boot up the the PBX server.

If everything is done as described above, the TE205P is successfully installed in the the PBX server.

#### T1 OR E1?

The jumper setting determines which provider type to select when creating the trunk: **Generic T1** (North America, 1.544 Mbps) or **Generic E1** (Europe, 2.048 Mbps).

### CREATING THE TRUNK

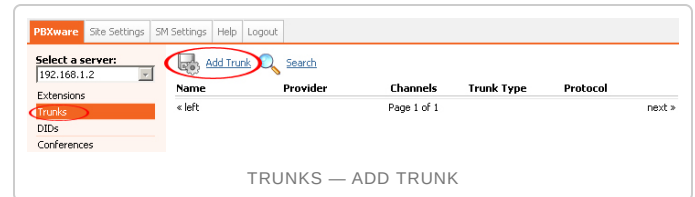
#### STEP ONE — ADD TRUNK

- Navigate to **Trunks** and click **Add Trunk**.
- Select the **Provider**: **Generic T1** or **Generic E1**, depending on how the TE205P jumper is configured (see Installation). This example uses **Generic T1**.
- Select **TE205P** from the **Device** list.
- Click **Next**.

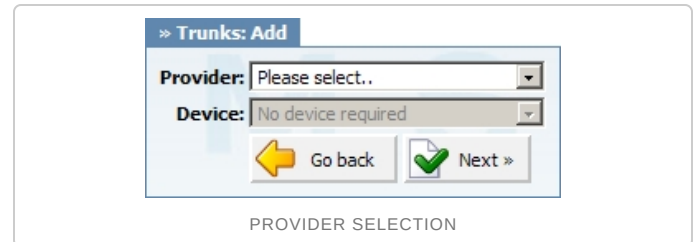
#### STEP TWO — TRUNK VALUES (REQUIRED)

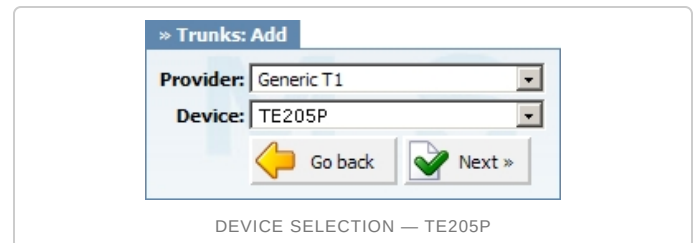

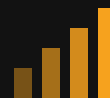
#### FINISH UP

### GLOSSARY

|                               |                                                                                                                                                                                               |
|-------------------------------|-----------------------------------------------------------------------------------------------------------------------------------------------------------------------------------------------|
| <b>T1</b>                     | North American standard for digital transmission — a link with a capacity of 1.544 Mbps, used to connect networks across remote distances; bridges and routers connect LANs over T1 networks. |
| <b>E1</b>                     | European format for digital transmission — a wide-area scheme used predominantly in Europe carrying data at 2.048 Mbps; E1 lines can be leased for private use from common carriers.          |
| <b>DHCP</b>                   | Dynamic Host Configuration Protocol — lets network administrators manage and automate IP address assignment.                                                                                  |
| <b>IP Address / LAN / WAN</b> | Internet Protocol address · Local Area Network · Wide Area Network.                                                                                                                           |
| <b>Local / Remote</b>         | Local: devices on the LAN. Remote: devices managed from a network other than the one they connect to directly.                                                                                |
| <b>Hub / Switch / Router</b>  | Connection point for network devices · selects a path for data to its next destination · forwards packets between LANs/WANs.                                                                  |
| <b>UAD</b>                    | User Agent Device.                                                                                                                                                                            |
| <b>PIN / Voicemail</b>        | Personal Identification Number · electronic voice messages stored until the recipient listens to them.                                                                                        |
| <b>Web Interface</b>          | The system of controls with which the user manages a device.                                                                                                                                  |
